School-based After-school Learning and Support Programme 2010/2011
Report

(I) Aim: The aim of this scheme is to develop the abilities of the youth in different areas, such as communications with parents, teachers as well as peer groups and the control of self-emotion. What's more, the purpose of the scheme is to build up one's confidence and have all-round development. What we expect to achieve, through this scheme, are as follows:

1. To build up the students' self-confidence to deal with their routine daily work, academic studies in particular.
2. To improve the students' social skills to communicate with their peer groups and adults.
3. To improve the students' self-determination and self-esteem and develop their self-efficacy.
4. To provide recognition for positive behaviour.
5. To promote the youth's moral competence.
6. To promote the youth's emotional competence.

(II) Target Group: The students from low-income families.

(III) Content: In order to fulfill the purpose of the scheme, the following activities were organised:

- (i) An after-school intensive English Enhancement Course was given to F. 7 students from September, 2010 to November, 2010, expecting to give them extra practice on the four language skills and a general review on how to deal with their Advance Level Examination.
- (ii) From September 2010 to November, 2010, rock-climbing training programmes were given to F. 1 to 4, mainly the students from low-income families. It is expected to build up their self-confidence and fortitude through the programmes and many students welcomed the training.
- (iii) Since the F.7 students had been offered training in generic skills by the English Department, the workshops on learning skills could then be offered to F.1 – F.3 students in December, 2010 so that more students could benefit.
- (iv) An after-school enhancement programme on Chinese, Mathematics and English was offered to F.3 students in May, 2011. The programme was run through small-group tutoring so that the individual needs of students could be catered for.
- (v) It was not able to arrange a suitable day with suitable weather for the war-game. The activity was cancelled in the end.
